Art Activity of the Week

Design a hat

Use the attached template or draw a hat shape.

In class, we always play a number song before maths so children know their number learning is about to start. We always try and 'grow' our fingers when we sing this song. Use the number line from your home pack.

Number to 10 song

Ladybird Activity: You will need : A ladybird picture and 5 to 10 small objects . These could be pen tops, pieces of play dough, sweets.



Print off the attached ladybird picture or draw a ladybird. Ask your child to place 5 spots (your objects) anywhere on the ladybird. Now, check you have 5 by counting carefully (line the objects up). Repeat the activity with 6,7,8,9 then 10 objects. Place them on the ladybird and line them up to check 'how many?' each time. Touch each object as you count.

Challenge : 10 spots Fold the ladybird in half. Draw spots (up to 10) on one half. Now, you need to remember how many you have drawn so **put the number in your head** and complete the other half of the ladybird. Now check you have 10 spots!
