Tier 3 restrictions

From Wednesday 2nd December, our area will move into tier 3 restrictions, very high. To try and help everyone understand the current restrictions, please find a reminder of the tier 3 restrictions below:

- You must not meet socially indoors with anybody you do not live with or have a support bubble with (unless they are part of a childcare bubble for under 14s) 'Indoors' means any indoor setting, including:
 - private homes
 - other indoor venues such as pubs and restaurants
- You must not meet socially outdoors (in a private garden or at most outdoor public venues), with anybody you do not live with or have a support bubble with
- * You can see friends and family you do not live with (or do not have a support bubble with) in some outdoor public places, in a group of up to 6. This limit of 6 includes children of any age. These outdoor public places include:
 - parks, beaches, countryside accessible to the public, forests
 - public gardens (whether or not you pay to enter them)
 - allotments
 - the grounds of a heritage site
 - Outdoor sports courts and facilities
 - Playgrounds
- When meeting friends and family you should also follow guidance on social distancing and limit how many different people you see socially over any period of time
- Social distancing and good hand hygiene will continue

We must all remain alert and follow recommended guidelines to ensure we are all safe.
