Planning Approved

On Friday 15th January, Middlesbrough council unanimously voted to approve the planning permission for the new build of Discovery Special Academy. This is a great moment.

We hope that ground works will begin in the next few weeks and will send pictures when they do.

National Lockdown

The National Lockdown is still in place. This is to slow the spread of coronavirus in our communities:

- 1. You must not leave or be outside of your home or garden except where you have a 'reasonable excuse'. A reasonable excuse includes:
- Work and volunteering
- Essential activities such as shopping, collecting medicines and to access critical services
- To attend education and childcare for those eligible
- Medical reasons, to escape risk of harm and compassionate visits
- For informal childcare for children 13 and under as part of a childcare bubble
- To exercise (alone, with your household/support bubble or with 1 other person)
- 2. Avoid meeting people you do not live with, except for specific purposes
- You must stay **2 meters apart** from anyone not in your household.
- You <u>MUST NOT</u> meet socially indoors or outdoors with family or friends unless they
 are part of your household or support bubble
- You can exercise outside or visit public places with the people you live with, your support bubble or with 1 person from another household
- You cannot meet in a private garden with people not in your household or support bubble
- 3. Close certain businesses and venues.
- All non-essential business have closed

A stay at home order has been issued, other than for legally permitted reasons, you MUST NOT leave your home
