Planting and growing





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Plant fruit pips and seeds in compost.
Keep the pot on a window sill or in a conservatory.

Sprinkle mustard and cress seeds on damp cotton wool or kitchen roll. When it grows, have a taste of the cress and mustard.

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Spring Flowers







Look in your garden or neighbourhood for spring flowers - crocuses, daffodils and tulips.

Watch how they grow and flower.

Fold a sheet of kitchen roll several times. Draw a line across the middle with felt-tip pen. Dip one end in a dish of clean water. Watch as the felt tip ink grows along the paper




Carefully place a circle of Skittles around the edge of a white plate. Gently add water. Watch the colours grow towards the middle.

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
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Leave a selection of ingredients/sweets in water overnight. Which ones grow bigger in the water?
