Family Hubs Launch Day

Members of Send Family Voice had the pleasure of attending the launch days for Dormanstown and Grangetown Family Hubs at the beginning of September. It was great to see the facilities updated and new services being introduced. Whilst attending the launch days, members of the forum met with professionals and made arrangements to drop into some of the services they are running which includes Portage. This is a service which works closely with parents and carers to support the development of children from 0 to 4 years who have additional needs.

The aim of Portage and the Early Years send team is to support the development of play, communication, relationships and full participation in day to day life within the family and community.



The Early Years send team work closely with a multiagency team. Referrals can be made to portage by parents and carers themselves by contacting 01642 770810 or by a professional who knows the child. A family hub referral form also needs completing and forwarding to Familyhubs@redcar-cleveland.gov.uk


Send Family Voice will be dropping into the the portage groups over the next couple of weeks to introduce ourselves and also provide support and guidance once parents and carers are discharged from their service.





Short Breaks for Children and Young People who have Additional Support Needs and/or a Disability

Short Breaks are available for children and young people who have additional support needs and/or a disability and are intended to have positive benefits for them and their parent carers. An overview of Redcar and Cleveland's Short Breaks Offer is outlined below.

Universal Services Birth - 25 years

Some families are able to get a Short Break by using free or low cost local services. These services are not funded or commissioned by the Local Authority. Examples of these are; school clubs, youth clubs, Scouts, Brownies, Guides, sport clubs and charity funded club provision. Services have a duty to make reasonable adjustments and must not treat a disabled person less favourably. Some universal services offer sessions specifically for children and young people with additional needs, however, not all universal services will be suitable for everyone.

Self-Referral Clubs

5 years up to 18 years (may extend to 25 years if there is an assessed need)

Our self-referral clubs take place after school, on weekends and during school holidays and are specifically for children with additional support needs and/or disabilities. These clubs are commissioned and funded by the Local Authority. The clubs take place in and around Redcar and Cleveland, providing children and young people with an opportunity to meet new people and try a wide range of activities such as sports, arts and crafts, cooking, music and much more.

Families can refer themselves to this service without the need for a social care referral or a diagnosis but must be able to evidence to the club their child/young person has additional support needs.

Social Worker Referral Services

Birth up to 18 years (may extend to 25 years if there is an assessed need)

Sometimes a child or young person may have more significant or complex needs due to their disability and/or family circumstances and will need more specialist support. Support may include one or more specialist services such as a personal assistant, overnight care in or away from the home, care in the home or in the community.

The level of support needed will be identified by a Social Worker assessment and a request for services will be presented to the Children with Disabilities Multi Agency panel for consideration. These services will be commissioned specifically for the child's/young person's needs or alternatively a family may prefer to request a **Direct Payment** to arrange the services themselves.

Additional Support

Max Cards - A Max Card is an activity discount card that enables SEND families to access activities and days out at a free or reduced rate. Free Max Cards are available for R&C SEND Children and Young People who are aged 0-25 years. Evidence of SEND required to allocate a card.

SEND Stay and Play Sessions - Free stay and play sessions specifically for SEND children and young people up to 18 years are available during the school holidays.

SEND Family Mailing List - The Short Breaks Team has a SEND Family Mailing List. Relevant information such as Short Break updates, training for parent carers, activities for children etc will be shared by email with families on the mailing list. This is an opt in service, evidence of SEND is required to join the mailing list.
